



During the Birmingham City Council Meeting on April 3rd, 2018, the City Council voted on the following items:

1. An Ordinance “TO FURTHER AMEND THE HUD BLOCK GRANT FUND BUDGET” for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, by transferring \$300,000.00 from CDBG Interim Float Loan, Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization, \$100,000.00 from CDBG Infrastructure, Grant Costs to be reimbursed and appropriating \$300,000.00 to CDBG Housing Rehab. Activities-Public Facilities, Grant Costs to be Reimbursed and \$100,000.00 to CDBG Commercial Revitalization-Micro Enterprise & Tech Assistance, Grant Costs to be Reimbursed.

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? The Community Development Block Grant funds that are being reappropriated will go towards two separate projects. The first will be a redevelopment project, including a walking trail, at Wahouma Park in East Lake for \$300,000.

The second project will go toward a small business grant program totaling \$100,000 that the Economic Development Department of the City of Birmingham will soon be announcing.

2. A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into Preliminary Engineering, Right-Of-Way Acquisition, and Construction Agreement with the State of Alabama; acting by and through the Alabama Department of Transportation for Project ST-037-999-018 Project Reference Number 100067672 Resurfacing Various City Streets in the City of Birmingham.

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? As part of the City's ongoing efforts to resurface streets throughout Birmingham, the approval of this item is the next in an ongoing process to improve our infrastructure. The Alabama Department of Transportation will contribute \$2.2 million to resurfacing streets in various locations across the City of Birmingham. The streets to be paved will be determined by a collaborative effort between the Mayor's Office and City Council. We will have more information about which streets are chosen for this particular project as soon as we can.

3. A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute an Agreement with Red Mountain Theatre Company, Inc., under which RMTTC will agree to make its facilities available, free to the public, for cultural events and training in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00 for its 2018 – 2019 fiscal year.

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? The Birmingham City Council approved a funding agreement with the Red Mountain Theatre Company, a non-profit theatre that has served Birmingham for over 30 years by providing quality entertainment and arts education. The \$50,000 agreement for the 2018-2019 fiscal year will allow the Red Mountain Theatre Company to provide free cultural programming and training to the community, including to an anticipated 13,000 Birmingham City School students.
