



During the Birmingham City Council Meeting on November 6th 2018, the City Council voted on the following items:

*1. A Resolution approving and authorizing the Mayor to execute an Agreement with the Birmingham Board of Education (BOE), pursuant to §16-11-9.1, Code of Alabama 1975, under which the BOE will provide assistance with building maintenance and equipment during the 2018- 2019 school year in the amount of \$35,000.00, consistent with the BOE's authority, as follows: Wenonah High School in the amount of \$5,000.00, Parker High School in the amount of \$10,000.00, Booker T. Washington K-8 in the amount of \$5,000.00, Hemphill Elementary in the amount of \$5,000.00, Arrington Middle School in the amount of \$5,000.00, and Glen Iris Elementary in the amount of \$5,000.00, said funding to come from the District 6 Discretionary Fund.*

**Was this item approved?** Yes

**What does this mean?** Councilor Sheila Tyson will be taking Office at the Jefferson County Commission on November 14th, and is using her District Office's Public Improvement Fund budget to help support 6 Birmingham City Schools. Historically, each City Council Office received \$50,000 in Public Improvement Funds (PIC), in addition to \$50,000 in Discretionary Funds. For the past two years, Council Offices have not been allocated funds specifically for Public Improvements, but PIC funds that were not spent accrued over the years.

*2. A Resolution finding that five hundred thirteen (513) properties have noxious or dangerous weeds growing thereon declaring said properties to be a public*

*nuisance and providing that notice shall be posted on each of said properties and notice sent by certified mail to the last person assessing these properties for state taxes and further providing for a public hearing December 11, 2018 to hear and consider all objections or protests to proposed abatement of these nuisances by the City.*

**Was this item approved?** Yes

**What does this mean?** City of Birmingham inspectors determined that 513 properties (listed in full on the Council meeting agenda) have overgrown weeds that are a public nuisance, and are giving notice to the owners of those properties that they have 30 days to remediate the issue. On December 11th, a Public Hearing item will appear on the City Council agenda to give these property owners a chance to object to the City abating the weeds.
