



During the Birmingham City Council Meeting on February 19th, 2019, the City Council voted on the following items:

- 1. A Resolution appointing two (2) members to the Birmingham Parking Authority, one (1) term expiring October 31, 2021 and one (1) term expiring October 31, 2022. (Submitted by Councilor O'Quinn, Chairman, Transportation Committee)*

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? The Birmingham City Council voted to re-appoint long time city employee Kevin Owens, and newly appoint Five Points West Community President, Dora Sims, to the Birmingham Parking Authority.

The Parking Authority regulates off street parking spaces, parking decks, and parking lots owned by the City of Birmingham. The board meets once a month and members are appointed by the Birmingham City Council.

The City of Birmingham provides many opportunities for citizens to get involved with public service. The City Council and Mayor's Office regularly appoint members to the City's many boards and agencies, which help recommend items covering every area of life and business in Birmingham. The applications are always open to the public, and vacancies are regularly announced on the City's Boards and Agencies online portal

2. A Resolution appointing one (1) member to the Birmingham Planning Commission for a term expiring October 6, 2024. (Submitted by Councilor Hoyt, Chairman, Planning and Zoning Committee)

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? The Birmingham City Council voted to re-appoint Ronald Crenshaw to the Birmingham Planning Commission. Mr. Crenshaw was previously serving a shortened term (due to a mid-term resignation of a former Planning Commission member).

The Birmingham Planning Commission is the official planning agency of the City of Birmingham. Its broad responsibility is to plan for the orderly physical development and/or redevelopment of the City, including its transportation network, public facilities, and the arrangement of land uses. More specifically, this Commission is responsible for preparing and maintaining, on a current basis, a Comprehensive Plan, which serves as an overall guide to coordinate private and public development within the City.

3. A Resolution recognizing the foresight and planning of the Birmingham Park and Recreation Board working with Cardiac Solutions to provide AEDs and training of its employees to use these devices for the benefit of all our citizens and visitors who use our park and recreation facilities

Was this item approved? Yes

What does this mean? Cardiac Solutions, one of the world's leading providers of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs), has installed 66 thus far units across the City's Park and Recreation Facilities, and at the City's pools. During events at Legion Field, trained Park and Rec Department lifeguards are on site with AEDs in backpacks.

An AED is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and pulseless ventricular tachycardia and is able to treat them through defibrillation, the application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to re-establish an effective rhythm.

This Resolution is a formal means of declaring the Birmingham City's Council's support for this initiative of the Birmingham Park and Recreation Board.
