Cory Jackson, Assistant Director, Birmingham Electrical Joint Apprenticeship Training Committee (BEJATC)

BEJATC is a training center for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), and represents the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA).

- · Website for additional information: bejatc.org
- The BEJATC combines classroom study and on the job training to create skilled tradesmen that have spent five years serving an apprenticeship under qualified journeyman electricians.
- Individuals can enroll in the program at any time after high school and can become a journeyman within five years.
- BEJCTA currently represents 200 apprentices going through their program.
- This is a 5-year training apprentice program.
- Classes are held one night per week.
- Minimum qualifications for the program:
 - Must be at least 18 years of age
 - Need basic math skills

b. SMART Technical Instructor – Joshua Hunter

- This is an Apprenticeship Training program approved and supervised by the program sponsor and the US Department of Labor Bureau of Apprenticeship.
- The programs consist of a combination of both classroom and on the job training.
- The apprenticeship program currently covers 60 members, with Birmingham being one of their largest jurisdictions.
- This is a four-year apprentice program.
- The program offers a myriad of training opportunities, including an indoor air quality technician.
- The indoor air quality technician is one of the more popular training initiatives.
- The indoor air quality technician goes in and evaluates the ventilation/air quality system to increase the air quality.
- Classes are mostly online to allow students to train at their own pace.
- Interested individuals must be at least 18 years of age.
