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A RESOLUTION TO STRONGLY ENCOURAGE THE USE OF PREQUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS IN THE SPECIFICATIONS FOR CITY OF BIRMINGHAM PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS FOR BIDDERS TO USE WORKERS AND APPRENTICES QUALIFIED THROUGH APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING PROGRAMS CERTIFIED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR OR THROUGH STATE OF ALABAMA PROGRAMS COMPLYING WITH U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR STANDARDS.

RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, in the City of Birmingham, the State of Alabama, and the United States, the number of skilled crafts workers and women qualified to perform quality and reliable work in the construction industry is insufficient to meet current demands;

WHEREAS, the State of Alabama has recognized this deficit and created the Alabama Office of Apprenticeship, recognized as a state apprenticeship agency by the U.S. Department of Labor to certify apprenticeship programs meeting the requirements of 29 CFR 29 and 30;

WHEREAS, the rate of training for new skilled crafts workers qualified to perform quality and reliable work in the construction industry is insufficient to replace the number of such crafts workers reaching retirement age;

WHEREAS, the training of new apprentices to become skilled crafts workers is critical to ensuring the continued supply of such crafts workers and to meet the continued demand for such work in the construction industry by and in the City of Birmingham and therefore serves the public interest;
