### IV. PRESENTATIONS

### ALABAMA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Dr. Yvette Richardson, Alabama Board of Education - District 4

Dr. Richards presented information on the State Department of Education, Legislative Session, and District Schools.

There is a new salary matrix for LPN's and nurses in the schools. It will increase to ensure that \$15.00/hour is the minimum pay for all personnel on a salary schedule. There are some personnel that will make more, depending on their level education.

There will be a two percent (2%) pay increase for all public education employees.

### **Updated TEAMS Matrix**

- There has been a push for STEM in the schools; technology, education, mathematics. Individuals who have master's degrees and passes a certain level are able to apply to become a TEAMS teacher.
- There will be career coaches in each district.
- The allotment for Reading Coaches is \$80,000.00 for district.
- This includes the amount for salary and fringe benefits.
- The local school district determines where those coaches will be placed.
- There was a \$25 million allotment for math coaches.
- National Board-Certified Teachers will receive an additional \$5,000.00 for being national board certified.

## <u>CALT</u>

- Each teacher who becomes a mentor receives an additional \$1,000.00 to their salaries (per year).
- Special Education teachers will receive an additional \$1,000.00 to their salaries (per year).
- Speech Pathologists will receive an additional \$1,000.00 to their salaries (per year).

## FINANCIAL LITERACY

- The Alabama State Department of Education mandates that all students take a course which includes financial literacy.
- The bill aligns the legislature's intent with the standards set by the Alabama State Department of Education.
- The Alabama State Department of Education will create an exam that would test on the standards of the approved financial literacy course.
- Alabama is the 5th in the nation for access to Financial Literacy.
- The test will be provided to all school districts and administered to each student.
- School districts will then provide exam results to the Alabama State Department of Education on a yearly basis.

## PRINCIPAL MENTORSHIP ACT

- Mentoring programs will be developed for new principals.
- Leadership Academy will be developed.
- Applications currently being solicited for Design Team.
- Comprehensive Professional Learning Plan by Spring 2024.
- The funding will begin Spring 2025.

## **TEACHING CERTIFICATIONS**

There is a teacher shortage.

The Alabama State Department of Education has been looking at various teaching certificates.

## **ALABAMA LITERACY ACT**

- Add age appropriateness to rubrics for reviewing core reading and intervention programs.
- Add the Director of ARI to the membership of the Literacy Task Force.
- Of the seven new members of the Literacy Task Force, two must be public k-12 teachers.
- Add two at-large members that will serve as the Chair and Vice Chair on a rotating basis.
  - One appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
  - One appointed by the Speaker of the House
- Members serve a four-year term and may be reappointed one additional two-year term.

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- Assessment list finalized for the 2021-2022 school year shall be valid for a period of five years, the list
  approved by the Literacy Task Force shall be valid for three years, staring with 2023-2024 school year;
  assessments may be added during the time period, but not removed.
- Literacy Task Force shall make public all rubrics and measurements used to determine eligibility and compliance for all assessments that applied for consideration.

## **ALABAMA ACCOUNTABILITY ACT**

- Increases scholarship amount from \$6,000.00 to \$10,000.00 per student in all grades.
- Expands definition of "eligible student" from 185% of the federal poverty level to 250% and eventually to 350%.
- Removes "failing school" and "non-failing" terminology and use "priority" and "qualifying"
- Lowest performing schools indicator as D and F; not bottom 6%.
- Increased cap from \$30 million to \$40 million initially, and possibly \$60 million in coming years, if the cumulative amount of tax credits issued exceed 90% of the cap in the three out of four years.

### **CHARTER SCHOOLS**

- Legislation is now in place to ensure charter schools.
- The Legislatures approved that charter schools are going to have their own office (their own person to oversee the charter schools).
- The Charter School Commission is working on appointments.
- The State Board of Education will ensure that the Charter School Commission comply with what the public schools are doing.

The Alabama Department of Education has:

- 18,661 trained teachers in math.
- 93 Regional Literacy Specialist
- 742 Local Reading Specialist
- 3,452 National Board-Certified Teachers
- 97 Posts

### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

Seventy percent (70%) of third graders are reading on grade levels.

### **Vocabulary Reading and Comprehension**

- 2021 77% of students were doing well
- 2022 78% of students were doing well
- 2023 76% of students were doing well

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## **GRADUAL RELEASE OF PEOPLE**

In 2019, 52 schools were identified as needing full support as far as how they were performing. In 2022, 35 of the schools were removed to limited support.
